

ZIALCITA REGAINS CROWN, BATAAC TAKES PRINCE

Rey Zialcita reclaimed the crown he lost last month to Ricky Duenas by defeating Brian Manibusan in the monthly finals of the Budweiser King of the Lanes. Both southpaws began the game with strikes, however, it was Zialcita who kept up the pace outdistancing his younger opponent and eventually winning the match easily with a 215-158 tally.

Zialcita tied Joey Miranda III for top honors during the six game qualifying round with identical 1182 sets. Zialcita's set included games of 232, 165, 176, 171, 235 and 203 while Miranda bowled games of 235, 166, 162, 176, 221 and 222. Ray Manibusan settled for third with a 1144 series followed by last month's King Ricky Duenas 1124, Jay Leon guereto 1121, Joey Laguana 1099, Brian Manibusan

1080, Manny Tagle 1078, Michael Joya 1062 and Art Gatmen's 1057 rounding off the top ten with the 3rd place through tenth place bowlers competing in an elimination round format.

Winners of the first round eliminations were Art Gatmen, Brian Manibusan, Michael Joya and Manny Tagle with Zialcita and Miranda receiving first and second round byes. Gatmen and Manibusan then defeated their respective opponents to advance to the semi-final round where Zialcita outduel Gatmen 203-177 while Manibusan's hot hand wiped out Miranda 267-213 to advance to the finals.

In the Prince of the Lanes, Ryan Bataac defeated Shannon Bukikosa for his first crown of the year 147+37 to 116+52. Bataac led all bowlers in the qualifying stage

with a 1212 total including 222 pins of handicap while Bukikosa's 1176 (312 handicap) was good for second. Filling out the remaining ten positions were Joe Cruz 1163, Peter Diego 1133, Edgar Caper 1131, Arelene Taitague 1130, Matt Nauta 1128, Mike Nauta Jr 1125, Douglas Cabrera 1112 and Teljann San Nicolas 1101.
