GATMEN, RANKIN CLAIM MAIDEN 2007 KING AND PRINCE

Art Gatmen and Leanne Rankin laid claim to their first monthly title for the year 2007 during the hosting of the Budweiser King and Prince of the Lanes held at the Central Lanes Bowling Center on Sunday, September 23, 2007.

Former National Team member Art Gatmen, now competing in the senior division, received a gift in the final match after National Youth Team member Keith Guerrero left the 3-4-5-8 bucket in the 10th frame. With the match closely contested, Guerrero spared the bucket and waited while Gatmen delivered his final frame. In the tenth, Gatmen spared a nine-pin count and struck to edge out the top seeded Guerrero on a 202-199 score.

7th seed Gatmen reached the finals for the first time this year by defeating 6th seed

Melvin Javier in the first round 221-212, then slipped by 5th seed Noel Ponseca 182-168 before toppling 2nd seed Ricky Duenas in the semi-final round 195-159. Top seeded Guerrero struck out in the tenth frame matching 3rd seed Virgil Toledo in the final stanza to advance 225-215.

Guerrero led all bowlers in the six game qualifier held earlier in the day with a 1297 total on games of 237, 192, 275, 208, 176 and 209. He was followed by Duenas' 1274, Ponseca 1265, Javier 1254, Toledo 1245, Aaron Elliott 1243, Robert Backer 1230, Gatmen 1229, Manny Tagle and JD Castro 1219 who rounded off the top ten bowlers advancing to the elimination rounds.

December Grand Finals with two monthly titles leads the Year to date standings with 142 points. He is joined by two time monthly winners Ray Zialcita (103 points) and Ricky Duenas (92) as automatic entries. Other bowlers with automatic berth via being crowned monthly champions are Freddie Cruz, Darryl Dimla and Gatmen.

In the Prince of the Lanes, Leann Rankin

outscored all her opponents averaging 203 pins per game on her way to routing the field. The top seed Rankin's win changes the title for another month to Princess of the Lanes as she beat out 3rd seed Shannon Bukikosa 213+24 to 130+52 in the semi-final match and 7th

seed Noel Cruz 181+24 to 149+29 in the monthly finals.

Rankin led the qualifying rounds held earlier in the day with a total pin count including handicap of 1364 points followed by Kyle Procalla 1329, Matthew Cruz 1303, Eddie Esteban 1299, Bukikosa 1296, Hiroki Guzman 1263, Lina Cruz 1262, Noel Cruz 1254, Roke Alcantara 1243 and Mike Ramos rounding off the top ten with a 1238 total.

With the win, Rankin also qualifies for the year end finals joining Bukikosa, Ryan Batac, Coleen Dela Cruz, John Raymundo, Peter Diego, Shellee Javier and Rudolfo Perez, all previous monthly champions in the division.

BOWLERS CONTINUE QUALIFYING FOR ASIAN INTERCITY



Guam's bowlers continued their qualifying rounds for the right to compete in the 21st Asian Intercity Bowling Championship which will be held in Jakarta, Indonesia from November 17-24, 2007.

Keith Guerrero led all prospective members with a 1325 six game set on games of 187, 259, 209, 188, 236 and 246 followed by JD Castro's 1298 total with a line of 235, 258, 230, 201, 232 and 142. Aaron Elliott finished in third place with a 1255 series while Brett Tibbatts rounds off the top four bowlers for the day with a 1240 total.

Jay Leon Guerrero continues to lead all qualifiers in the composite averages with 231 pins per game followed by Guerrero 220, Joey Miranda III 208, JD Castro 206, Virgil Toledo 204, Aaron Elliott 203, Manny Tagle 202 and Robert Baker 199.

The women's division is led by Felymar Mandapat 201 composite average, Leanne Rankin 183, Marie Velasco 176 and Shannon Bukikosa 166.

Terry Roberto claimed her second monthly Senior Bowler of the Lanes title of 2007 by squeaking by Vivian Tedtaotao 174+45 to 170+43 in the championship round of the elimination format.

Both bowlers had to win three other preliminary matches before the finals showdown. 8th seed Roberto defeated 4th Paul Untalan in the first round 173+45 to 161+21, 5th seed Cindy Reyes 191+45 to 179+44 in the second round and 2nd seed Alan Damian 224+45 to 152+44 in the semi-final round. 10th seed Vivian Tedtaotao beat out 5th seed Art Gatmen 189+43 to 213+5 in the first round, 7th seed Rick Torres 181+43 to 158+14 in the second round and top seed Kin Sablan in the semi-final round 182+43 to 141+33 to set up the finals match up.

A six game qualifier was held earlier in the day to determine each bowler's seeding of which Sablan topped all bowlers with a 1351 total including handicap of 198 pins, followed by Damian's 1328 (264), Reyes 1321 (264), Untalan 1304 (126), Art Gatmen 1280 (30), Rudy Palaganas 1265 (54), Rick Torres 1243 (84), Roberto 1240 (270), Hermee Maravilla 1234 (138), Tedtaotao 1232 (258) rounds off the top ten.

The next Senior Bowler of the Lanes monthly tournament will be held on Sunday, October 21, 2007 at the Central Lanes Bowling Center at 9am.

LEON GUERRERO FINISHES HK OPEN IN 26TH PLACE

Jay Leon Guerrero finished the Hong Kong International Open in 26th place moving up from a first day finish of 29th. Leon Guerrero finished the 16 game set with a total of 3173 pinfalls (198 average) with games of 209, 177, 191, 190, 172, 197, 209 and 199 on the first block and 235, 184, 188, 212, 191, 213, 195 and 211 on the second block.

LEON GUERRERO FINISHES 18TH IN SINGAPORE OPEN

Jay Leon Guerrero dropped from 4th to 18th place in the final standings of the 40th Singapore Open held at Superbowl Safra Bowling Center in Singapore City. Leon Guerrero was unable to carry the momentum of the first day but was able to bounce back from a slow start settling with games of 183, 194, 178, 173, 248, 210, 226 and 237 for a 1649 total (206 average). The two day total of 3512 for 16 games dropped his average to 219 pins.

LEON GUERRERO IN 4TH AFTER 1ST BLOCK OF SINGOPEN

Jay Leon Guerrero moved up to fourth place after a slow start in the first of the two day finals for the 40th Singapore International Bowling Open which features several world champions and a professional bowler currently being contested in Superbowl Bowling Center in Singapore. Leon Guerrero shot an eight game set of 1863 for a 232 average on lines of 191, 222, 223, 237, 260, 253, 238 and 239. Leon Guerrero credits his strong performance to coach Johnson Cheng of the Philippines of whom kept him in line with precise lane adjustments.

Somjed K. of Thailand leads the tournament with a blistering 1981 performance averaging 247 pins per game. Somjed bowled games of 228, 246, 269, 276, 207, 209, 299 and 247. Former Asian Games and 2004 Guam Open Champion Remy Ong of Singapore ranks second

with a 1877 total with the Professional Bowlers Association's 2005 bowler of the year Mika Koivuniemi of Finland in third, just two pins behind, with a 1875. Leon Guerrero sits in fourth place, 12 pins behind, while Carl DeVries of Singapore follows in 5th with an 1852 total while 2006 World Men's Champion Biboy Rivera of the Philippines is in 6th with an 1846 total. Other notables include 5 time world champion Paeng Nepomuceno fresh off an Australian title of the Philippines in 12th place with a 1807 total and multiple medallist Daniel Lim of Malaysia who bowled a perfect 300 game in 8th place.

Thirty nine bowlers made the cut which consists of the top 13 Singapore bowlers, top 12 International bowlers, top 13 Mixed pool and the defending champion Lu Yu Wen of Singapore for the two day finals with Leon

Guerrero claiming the final position in the mixed pool, bowling a four game qualifier of 915 pins. The bowlers are competing for the first place prize of S\$25,000.00.

Leon Guerrero is accompanied by Rey Zialcita and Robert Baker, both of whom missed the cut for the Men's A qualifier.
