

ANOTHER KING TITLE FOR GUERRERO PEREZ EARNS PRINCE

Keith Guerrero defeated top seed Rey Zialcita in the monthly finals of the Budweiser King of the Lanes to claim his second title of the year. The second seed Guerrero matched Zialcita's titles for the year with a 257-219 victory connecting eight strikes in a row to seal the deal. With the win, Guerrero moves ahead of Zialcita in the Points standings accumulating 122 points to Zialcita's 101.

Guerrero and Zialcita disposed their opponents in the semi-final matches rather handily with Zialcita beating 7th seed Aaron Elliott 194 to 165 and Guerrero bulldozing over 3rd seed Brian Manibusan 237-181. Both bowlers received byes in the first and second rounds via a 1-2 finish in the qualifying rounds held earlier in the day.

In the qualifying rounds, Zialcita led all bowlers with a 1397 total (232 average)

on games of 257, 257, 214, 228, 233 and 208. Guerrero followed suit on 1361 pinfalls with Manibusan right behind finishing the six game set with a 1352 total. Ricky Duenas' 1324 set put him in fourth place followed by JD Castro 1296, RJ Santos 1278, Aaron Elliott 1260, Albert Dela Cruz 1250, Jim Pinault 1249 and Maleeque Parker's 1248 round off the top ten qualifiers.

In the Prince of the Lanes, Rudolpho Perez edged out Lisa Duenas in the finals to claim his maiden title 222 (172+50 handicap) to 219 (182+37 handicap). Perez watched as Duenas' pocket shot in the tenth frame left a solid ten pin before celebrating his victory. In the semi-final round Perez slipped by top seed Matthew Cruz 220 (170+50) to 217 (157+60) while Duenas escaped with a 228 (191+37) to 226



(178+48) tilt against 3rd seed Mike Ramos.

Cruz led all bowlers in the six game qualifier with a 1467 total on 360 pins of handicap. Duenas finished second with a 1411 total (222 handicap) followed by Mike Ramos 1384 (288), Yulki Guzman 1348 (312), Justin Cabrera 1343 (242), Perez 1322 (300), Hiroki

Guzman 1309 (402), Albert Villaluz 1307 (156), Chris Leal 1305 (382), Shannon Bukiyosa 1285 (312) rounded off the top ten.

The next Budweiser King and Prince of the Lanes will be held on Sunday, September 23, 2007 at 9:00 a.m. at the Central Lanes Bowling Center.

DAMIAN WINS AUGUST SENIOR BOWLER OF THE LANES

Alan Damian evoked his "president" ability powers by defeating Kin Sablan 218+44 (handicap) to 179+33 (handicap) in the monthly finals of the Senior Bowler of the Lanes held on Sunday, August 26, 2007.

The President of the Guam Senior Bowlers' Golden Club climbed the ladder after finishing in 6th place during the qualifying rounds held

earlier in the day. Damian defeated 7th seed Clyde Santos in the first round of the elimination format 178+44 to 170+32, then beat out 5th seed Helen Charfauros 166+44 to 139+60. In the semi-final round, Damian routed top seed Terry Roberto 205+44 to 160+45 to qualify for the finals against Sablan. 9th seed Sablan also took the scenic route defeating 3rd seed Isabel Tudela

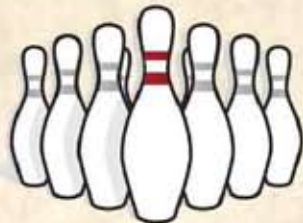
199+33 to 163+54, then dispatched 4th seed 179+33 to 168+33 before eliminating 2nd seed Rudy Palaganas 215+33 to 191+9.

In the six game qualifier, Roberto bowled a 244 sixth game to boost her to the top spot finishing with a 1384 total with 270 pins of handicap slipping past Palaganas 1376 (54). Isabel Tudela finished in third with a 1361 total

GUAM BOWLERS FINISH IN THE MIDDLE OF THE PACK

Guam's Youth Team represented in the 14th Asian Youth Terpin Bowling Championship was able to forge their way to the middle of the pack after a slow start in the final day of team competition finishing in 10th place at the Holiday Inn Lido Bowling Center being staged in Beijing, China.

Starting off in 13th place after the long oil pattern three game squad held on Sunday, August 19, 2007, Team Guam began on a rocky gate with Keith Guerrero bowling a 150 in the first of three game sets on the short oil pattern which was the better of the scoring patterns. Charlie Catbagan and Brian Manibusan also got off the blocks gingerly with games of 180 and 182 while John John Ada was the lone bright star in the first game with a 223. Things started looking up in the second game as Guerrero finally found his groove stringing six strikes in a row to end up with a 224 game after leaving a pocket 7-10 split in the 9th frame while Catbagan shot a 192 game with Manibusan still having problems ending with a 150 and Ada's 200 for a 779 set. The third game saw Guerrero continue on his striking momentum flushing the pocket from the second frame to the ninth to finish the tournament with a 268 game. Catbagan and Ada were only able to muster games of 168 and 180 respectively while Manibusan bounced back with a 210 to help the team end on a high note with a 813 set. Combined six game totals for Guam's delegates in the team event include Guerrero 1186, Catbagan 1118, Manibusan 1134 and Ada 1179.

The team event is headed Kuwait winning the first gold ever in the Asian Youth Championship Team Event with a 4346 total followed by Saudi Arabia 4913, Malaysia 4897, Republic of Korea 4897, Japan 4814, Thailand 4707, Macau 4659, Hong Kong 4652, Philippines 4636, Guam 4597, Australia 4581, Chinese Taipei 4559, China 4459, Indonesia 4489, Qatar 4369, Egypt 4209, Democratic People's Republic of Korea 4111 and United Arab Emirates 4075.

Ada led Guam's contingent in the 18 game total All Events finishing the championship in 28th place with sets of 1114, 1198 and 1179 for a total of 3491 (193 average). Guerrero who slipped to 53rd place jumped to 35th after games of 284 and 268. He bowled sets of 1168, 1058 and 1106 for a 3422 total (190 average). Catbagan and Manibusan were able to improve on their scores after each event ending in 59th and 63rd place respectively on sets of 1032, 1106 and 1118 for a series of 3256 (182 average) and 385, 1026 and 1134 for a total of 3165 (178 average).
